Why UWindsor Nursing?

LEADING PROGRAM Our program is among the top Nursing programs in Canada. Our students consistently achieve a high NCLEX year-end pass rate that is significantly higher than the provincial average. Check out our ratings and our NCLEX-RN pass rates! NEW: We are responsible for delivering the Ontario University Consortium RN Prescribing Education Program for practicing Registered Nurses. In addition, starting Fall 2025, we are the first BScN program to offer optional RN prescribing and graduate RNs with prescribing authority in spring 2026.

JOIN THE COMMUNITY: UWindsor has expert faculty and offers a welcoming environment fostering professionalism, inclusion, equity, and support. We offer a Clinical Learning Centre and Simulation Suite featuring our **Peer Mentor program** to help students refine their nursing skills.

YOU WILL LEAD: Students learn to lead the profession through scholarship, research, and professional development opportunities. Nursing students in Outstanding Scholars work closely with professors to advance nursing knowledge. Join the Research Collaborative as a volunteer to assist faculty with active research projects. Clubs like Nursing Society, UWindsor Welcomes Nursing Students (UWNS), Canadian Black Nurses Alliance, and the Mental Health & Wellness Outreach team (MHWOT) help to develop student leadership skills. Some nursing students also work as peer mentors in the nursing labs, helping their peers succeed in their learning journey!

MASTER YOUR SKILLS: Learn from award-winning faculty and clinical instructors. UWindsor has a concept-based curriculum allowing learners to gain confidence and independence over time through themes: Year 1- Nurse as Professional; Year 2- Nurse as Collaborator; Year 3 Nurse as Change Agent; Year 4- Nurse as Coordinator. Clinical practicums and experiential learning labs start in year 1 and increase in complexity.

STRONG EXPERIENTIAL LEARNING We offer over 200 clinical placements in the hospital and community. Clinical starts in Year 1 on a medical and/or surgical unit at a hospital in the Windsor area. We offer a 1:8 clinical instructor-student ratio for nursing students in years 1-3. Year 4 students are paired with RN preceptors and faculty advisors to facilitate their clinical practicum learning. From first year, students participate in simulation labs with high-fidelity manikins and group scenarios to guide their learning.

OPPORTUNITIES OUTSIDE THE CLASSROOM: Participate in professional development events, **study abroad** in places like Sweden, Australia, or Tanzania, help faculty with research, and receive certifications toward professional development through the internationally recognized Institute for Health Improvement (IHI Open School). Get recognized for your volunteer work by earning a gold, silver, or bronze **LEAD medallion** upon graduation.

FINANCIAL SUPPORT Check out the Learn & Stay Grant to learn more about free tuition! Additionally, 1 out of 5 Nursing students receive awards or scholarships.
